Mayor Ali's Summer Youth Intern Program

ICC's Workforce Department coordinated with various internal departments to place four students participating in Mayor Ali's Summer Youth Internship Program. The program employs 8th grade graduates age 14-15 from Peoria schools transitioning to Peoria District #150 High Schools in Fall 2022. To participate in the program, each student had to submit recommendations from their school leadership as well as having successfully completed the screening process led by the City of Peoria and Mayor Ali's office. Once selected, the Mayor's office collaborates with area businesses to place the students in work assignments that teach them essential skills associated with employability.

The four students placed at ICC worked in various areas of the college including Human Resources, Corporate & Community Education, Workforce Department, TRiO-Upward Bound, and Health Careers. The students worked on campus Monday-Friday, four hours per day and were assigned to a different department weekly so they could gain a diverse experience with each department. Students were able to learn how to work in an office environment and learn various professional office skills such as copying, typing, filing and soft skills. They all walked out better understanding the value of arriving on time, being dependable and taking pride in the quality of their work.

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Innovative Bridge and Transition to Health Careers

The first cohort of 14 students participated in the Innovative Bridge and Transition to Health Careers program held from June 6 – July 28, 2022. Students participated in a curriculum that included digital literacy certifications in Microsoft Suite, upskilling in reading and math, OSHA 10 General Industry Certification, GPEAK Essential Employability Skills, CPR industry certification, ICC 104 (credit course in Health Careers) and incorporated Social and Emotional Learning.

Students received one-hour of college credit for completing the ICC 104 Health Careers class. This class consisted of tours in every health career area of the ICC Peoria Campus. In addition, the students were trained to work in CANVAS to complete work assignments, which helped



prepare them for postsecondary coursework at the college this fall.

The students were assigned a final project that consisted of choosing, researching and creating a presentation focused on a specific health career and delivering the presentation to the class to build and develop communication skills.

Students completing the Innovative Bridge and Transition have enrolled in credit courses including CNA and EMT for this fall semester.



Rapid Enrollment Days for new students. We had over 67 students make RSVPs, 54 attended and all enrolled (100%) with 545 hours.

Daily Visits: We saw a record number of 70 daily visits to the office. Sixty-four wanted to start for the Fall 2022 term, and forty students (62%) are currently enrolled.

SMS Campaigns: Admissions implemented and managed all the SMS enrollment campaigns in Target X for Fall 2023. These campaigns have been executed weekly since the middle of July. The objective was to either notify students of upcoming dates or identify if a student needed any assistance.

Human Resources

Human Resources has had a very busy summer! We welcomed 3 new individuals to the HR team and they are all doing great with their training and settling into their new roles. As a team this summer, we have onboarded just over 200 employees, processed changes for over 100 employees, processed increases of 3% for staff effective July 1 and additional increases of 2.5% effective August 1. We have various processes and documents that are also being updated/revised that we hope to roll out this fall. A huge thank you to our Board of Trustees for approving additional increases for staff due to an extraordinary time of inflation.

ICC has begun the process of constructing the ERP RFP document, for a planned public release in mid-to-late August. 26 meetings were held with functional teams representing 24 departments across campus to begin designing demonstration scripts. In September, these scripts will be provided to the top 2-3 responding vendors. Beginning in December and continuing into January, the top vendors will be asked to come on campus and show the ICC functional teams how their systems would perform the scripts. This will give great comparative insight into the internal workings of the systems and how effectively they can address the needs of our students and staff.

Facilities

Facilities has several projects that we are working that are in different phases of development.
